1983 ANNUAL REPORT

Many Sheldon families that originated in the Suffield area where the 1982 meeting was held migrated to the Rupert area. Marie had appliqued and hand painted the Sheldon Coat of Arms on a large banner. It was a beautiful piece of handwork and I hope it will be on display at future meetings. She also had arranged a large display of pictures of people and homes in that area in past years. Also a postcard of one of the early "Meetings" of the Sheldon Family about 1911, held under a large tent.

Edna Marotz of Sheboygan, Wis., age 84, was the oldest present. The youngest was Julie Holmes. The largest group was Mr. H. Austin Sheldon Jr. of West Babylon, New York, his son H. Austin Sheldon III and daughter Ann. Sheldon Muffly and grandchildren Kim and Karen Sheldon, Megan, Bill and Kerri Muffly. It was gratifying to see so many children attending this year. Mark Sheldon of Hayward, California, who came by the way of their new home in Jacksonville, Fla.

Friday morning Betty Sheldon introduced her genealogy committee. Several new ideas were tried this year. After Betty Sheldon's report on her very busy year helping people track down elusive ancestors, she had everyone present divide into groups of their immigrant lineage. Isaac had the most but all were represented. Then each group divided up even more by the next generation or two down. In doing this a person could easily find if there were others from their particular line there. I'm sure we will do this again.

It was voted to have an Historian and Keith Sheldon and Phyllis Clark were nominated. The president cast one vote for the slate of officers.

Keith Sheldon has finished his book on the John of Providence line, 920 pages. He has presented a copy to Betty to use in her work, as chairman of the Genealogical Committee. Eugene R. Kosche, Senior Curator of the Bennington Museum gave a very interesting talk on "Bennington and the Revolution." We learned a lot of history, at least I did. Later that afternoon many of us went to Bennington Museum to see their extensive collections. We also visited the Grandma Moses schoolroom and saw her paintings. As we drove around Bennington we saw many old historic homes as well as a visit to the historic Old First Church in Bennington and the Bennington Monument standing majestically on top of a hill.

At the Friday evening Dinner Col. Roscoe Sheldon (Marie and Clara's cousin) led us in prayer. Clara, as Master of Ceremonies, led us in singing "Hello Sheldons" sung to the tune Hello Dolly. Clara spoke on early Rupert and the area where so many Sheldons migrated to from Suffield, Conn., and the hard life they lived making a living on the hilly, rocky land. Dorothy Offensend spoke on Sheldons, Pawlet, Rupert and the "Border War". Again, we learned much history. Another "original" song followed, "You're a Sheldon." Then Clara presented a slide show of many old Sheldon homes in the Rupert area, many of which we would see on Saturday.

We paused in our busy week-end to remember those who left their earthly home this past year, one of whom was to have been our speaker this evening with Clara, Dr. Edward Sheldon of Vermont.

We closed the Friday evening session with another "original" song, sung to the tune of Edelweiss.

Saturday morning we boarded two buses at 8:30 for the trip to Rupert. Talented Marie had drawn a map for each one, showing where all the early Sheldon houses were, the Church, cemeteries etc. The bus drivers were familiar with the area and added bits of information of interest. Marie was the guide on one and Clara on the other. They grew up in this area and added many interesting stories. We stopped at the Congregational Church in Rupert, the oldest church in Vermont still being used. As we all sat in the pews and heard about its history we could almost feel the presence of our ancestors who worshipped there many years ago. It was suggested we ought to sing "Bless be the Tie that Binds". Clayton V. Weber of Brookondale, N.Y. volunteered to lead us and Rose Sheldon Newton of Fort Wayne, Ind. volunteered to play the organ. A moment to long remember. Beside the Church was the Cemetery where all the many Sheldon graves were marked with red flags. Across "The Street" as we had learned it was always called, was very appropriately The Sheldon General Store, a typical small country store with many items. At the Church we were also able to purchase two books written by Ruth Rasey, concerning early Rupert, "Out of the Salt Box" and "Hand Hewn in Old Vermont". The author was there to autograph them.

The mountains were beautiful even though the clouds hung low. Then on to "Hildene" the summer home of Robert Todd Lincoln, son of Pres. Abraham Lincoln in Manchester, Vermont. First we saw a slide show of the family life of Robert Todd Lincoln and his descendants. His unmarried granddaughter was the last occupant and she died in 1975. Then it was sold. Marie and Clara's brother Frank Sheldon, his wife Beverly and their daughter Jennifer were our hosts for a picnic lunch they had prepared. It was served on the spacious grounds of "Hildene" at picnic tables. After lunch some of us walked the short distance up the hill for the tour of the mansion. Others rode up in an horse drawn wagon.

Our host there was another Sheldon - David C. Sheldon, Exec. Director of "Hildene". He described the beautiful "player organ" and played it for us. Again we joined in singing familiar tunes. The tour of the house was very interesting and we are fortunate that there are organizations to "rescue" these old, beautiful homes across America.

The rest of the time was free time until dinner, which was set up around the pool, in the lobby of the Motel. A very beautiful setting. We adjourned to the Theater Room for the final meeting.

The report of the Board of Directors was given. The Board voted to continue to contribute to the four groups we have been giving to, Firelands Museum, in Ohio; Old Indian House, Deerfield, Mass.; Sheldon Art Museum; Pocumtuck Valley Memorial, Deerfield. We voted to donate \$100. to the Bennington Museum as our Friday night speaker Eugene Kosche, Director donated his time. Neither were we charged an entrance fee to Hildene. We voted to donate \$300. to them, which news was enthusiastically received by Mr. David Sheldon. Next year's meeting will be August 3 & 4, 1984 in Providence, R.I. Mark your calendars now. L.Hazard Knowles will be working on organizing that. This meeting will be in honor of John #8 of Providence. More information will be forthcoming in the next mailing on this.

Carrying out the thought of "Sheldon Achievers" Pres. John Sheldon spoke of several Sheldon Achievers he had heard about in the papers.

4. Sheldon Axle Co. in Boise, Idaho. Mrs. Theodore Johnston of Seattle was able to tell us more on that.
5. Sheldon Morrison Knudson, owner of Sheldon Truck - Sterling Transit Company of Los Angeles, bought out by Pierce Arrow long ago.
6. Mr. & Mrs. Fred Speiss of Walnut Creek, Calif. celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. We wish them many more years together.
7. Alfred C. Sheldon of West Suffield, Conn. (your new secretary's father) retired this year as Treasurer of Second Congregation 1 Church, where we had lunch last year. He had served 45 years. His grandfather was appointed treasurer in 1863, his father Charles took over in 1913, and Alfred took over from him in 1937. That is a record that will be hard to beat. The church had a celebration dinner in his honor in April and presented him with a color TV with remote control. Three days later his family held open house for him on his 90th birthday.

Miriam Sheldon Ryan of Sandy Point, Maine, our secretary for the last ten years asked not to be secretary again. We all appreciate all the many hours she has devoted to writing letters to us and keeping track of the membership list. We are sorry she was not able to be with us this year so we could personally thank her, instead we gave her a round of applause. We are sure she has many other activities that she can now devote more time to. Thank you Miriam for a job "well done".

John introduced the new officers and David Sheldon and his wife of "Hildene" Hazard Knowles spoke of his Grandfather William H. Sheldon who was a Trap Shooter and was invited to England to shoot against Bogadus in a match. He also spoke of his Uncle Dr. William H. Sheldon a Psychology Professor at several well known Universities and also an author of psychology textbooks. He also wrote "Early America Cents" and "Penny Whimsy" books on Coins.

Mark Sheldon took over the meeting at this point and presented gifts to Marie and Clara for their work organizing our wonderful week-end. He reminded everyone to come to Providence in 1984. Mr. Weber directed us in singing "Auld Lang Syne" and we closed another meeting of the Sheldon Family Assoc. Thanks Marie and Clara for a wonderful week-end in Sheldon Land in Rupert area.

On a personal note; as I take over this job from Miriam I only hope that I can do half as good as she has done. Please keep me posted as to births, deaths, marriages, change in marital status etc. Also any change in address, so we can keep the records up to date. REPORT of the 2nd V.P., Chairman, Genealogical Comm.

This has been another very busy year for my office as second Vice-President, the chairman of the Genealogical Committee. Locating ancestors, making new cards for new members and their ancestors, plus some of their descendants, indexing and cross-indexing and corresponding with many of you, receiving your information and classifying it so that it can be found again: generations sheets, family pedigrees, census records, photo-copies of old County Histories, photographs and newspaper clippings. So far, I've been unable to devise a method of sharing this work. It all has to be kept at one central location. Some of the members of this committee have been alert to my needs, however, and have kept in touch, sharing bits of information as I question them, adding to the "In Search of Sheldon Kin! such as the KING chart you all received.

This work continues at a steady pace. I try to be prompt with correspondence, but like the late Leland L. Sheldon used to write, "My filing system is not always 100% efficient," neither is mine. If I owe a letter, I urge you to remind me by postcard. Sometimes I'm waiting for answers from others before relaying information; sometimes I think an answer is not required. Obviously, some of you think my letters do not require answers, for I wait months, even years, for answers to questions that are needed to number individual persons cards that they may be indexed.

However, there have been many letters with helpful enclosures that have arrived at my mailbox this year, I hesitate to mention individuals for fear of leaving someone out. I'm just not able to list you all, but I DO THANK YOU ALL. I've found a "God Knows Who" member who now has a number, in Keith's new book, John Sheldon of Providence. This book has not as yet been printed for sale to the public. We have one of the few 'draft' copies. If you are interested in this giant production, you should contact him at: 23918 Wolf Road, Bay Village, Ohio 44140. I've found various dates in the Collection of Vital Records of Connecticut by L. Barbour which was sent to me, and with this have been able to find and furnish more data on certain lines. A lady in Iowa set off a chain reaction when she sent information with which I could connect with another GKW, and the response of another lady in New York gave us the connection of still another GKW in Orange County. So it's not that I did this, but that WE have done it, and again, my hearty thanks to those involved. We still have a long ways to go to find more connections for our GKW members who only need another generation of information, most likely, so I ask that any members who still have lineages not yet submitted or up-dated to send what you have anyway. We have far too many members who have belonged for many years that we cannot identify. Earlier, indices were not in existence for non-SHELDON surnames, and occasionally a few SHELDEN/SHELDON names have been lost in the shuffle. Hopefully this fall, we will list those whose SHELDON numbers we cannot locate. This will not knowingly include the GKW folks. We may do that another time.

From my plea of a year ago, we have received a number of photocopies of genealogies, or part thereof, pertaining to the wives of some of our early SHELDON men. Among them are: BIRDSALL, BREWSTER - as related to S#580 of the Isaac line, S#8921 of the Godfrey line, S#6014x3 of the John of South Kingston line, and S#'s 5403 and 5476x1 of the John of Providence line, CARPENTER, CLARK, CRANDALL, GREELEY; the Ezekiel MAIN family, POTTER as it relates to the wife of S#80 Isaac SHELDON, GIFFORD, SOULE, Elder John STRONG of Northampton, MA, some of the descendants of Philip SHERMAN, First Secretary of Rhode Island, WHITING, WOODFORD and BLOTT. Also the SKELTON line that shows it was the famed Rev. Samuel SKELTON who married Susanna TRAVIS, not either a SHELTON or a SHELDON.

This past year we finally embarked on the project of having the Mormon records searched, primarily to find out what they really have on our progenitors. Through one of our members, I received a list of qualified people who might be of assistance. After writing letters which brought no response, I finally received a phone call from a woman who was quite excited about our project. She's a native of New England and thought she could be of help. But we didn't hear from her for sometime, even when we tried nudging her, and it was too late this year to make any more plans with her. As it turned out, she was taken seriously ill for most of the winter months. She did her work well, sent quite a report, but most every thing she found was tied in to the New England Historical & Genealogical Society's report in their printed issue in October, 1926, of J. Gardner Bartlett's report which we too printed with Mrs. Frank Merritt Sheldon, "The SHELDONS of Bakewell, Derbyshire, England and Isaac Sheldon of New England." Any future searching out there would be pure 'digging' through one clue to another, much as Mr. Don Steel suggested we do right here in New England - hunting up and checking out other families, be they in-laws or neighbors. Our next step, then, is to concentrate on records of sources not yet worked over, by our employing someone of ability and imagination in this area, Salem, Providence and the Narragansett area.

Volumes one and six of the SHELDON MAGAZINE are depleted. We have no more 3 ring covers, just the spring-type covers. We will be having more volumes made to provide complete sets this fall. After they are gone, in a few years, maybe more, we will consider it 'out of print' and will embark on a new project of revision, separating the individual lines into individual books.

It has been found that the wife of S#715 John Sheldon was NOT Sophia WHITE as noted on page 21r of the SHELDON MAGAZINE, nor did he die in 1823. A descendant, Laura DEAKIN of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, has sent proof that S#715 John, Jr. (1779-1854) married Rosannah HARRINGTON, and they lived first in Adams, MA, then Illinois and Wisconsin. Keith M. SHELDON has corroborated this recently when he made a trip to Pittsfield, MA to check vital records of Adams. The children of S#715 are as listed on p. 23r, but have been renumbered according to birth-dates in our files. Mrs. DEAKIN has supplied our records with the spouses for each.

Sophia, or Sophie, was the wife of John S#8420. They lived in Alden, NY. No family has been found for them.
